Carla Putrich, a Granger Gazette reader, wrote to tell us of a good deed that did not go unnoticed. Times are tough for many families and as the cold weather sets in around the holidays, things can get tougher. Here is the story of two business owners who stepped up to help families in need.

"During this time of year we often hear or read about people going above and beyond what they have to do to help other people. I happen to know someone that started helping parents in need of a break two years ago and has recently stepped up to help families in need again," writes Carla.

Mike and Beth Garatoni own Growing Kids Learning Center. During December of 2008, the couple noticed stress levels in many families were at an all time high. In an effort to help, they offered a free night of childcare to families. In the true spirit of goodwill they continued to occasionally offer a free Saturday night of childcare in 2009.

Carla writes, "They weren't sure if (the stress) was due to the holidays, the economy or both, but it didn't really matter; they just knew they wanted to help the families by giving them a break."

Through 2010 the Garatonis have offered one free Saturday night of childcare each month. In addition, Carla writes, Mike and Beth are not only now giving families two free Saturdays of childcare, but they have offered to help even more. Mike sent a letter to parents titled "Operation Snowpants." In it Mike offers to buy families that are having financial difficulties proper winter attire for the children, including hats, gloves and snow pants. Since Growing Kids is a licensed center, outside playtime is required for the children as part of their day. It is required that all children go outside when the temperature, including wind chill is above 25 degrees.

"The problem is not all the children have the proper clothes: winter coat, hat, gloves and snow pants. Mike stated that this is not something he normally does and may not be able to do in the future, but he just knew it is cold outside and decided to do something," said Carla.


